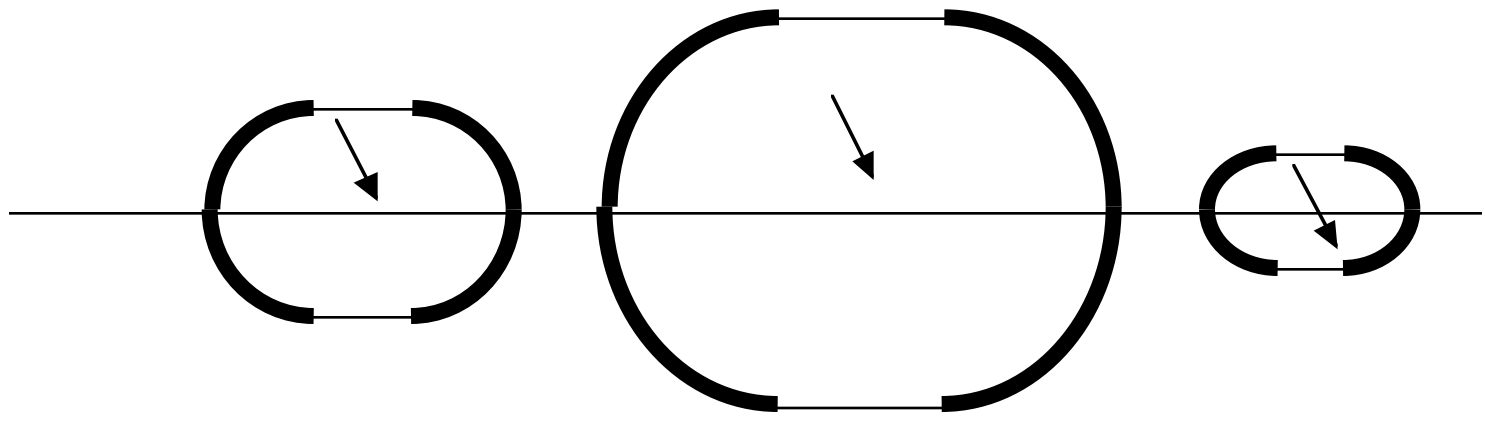

Page 1B: Eggs pop-ups

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
- 2) Fold sheet 1A in half along fold line.
- 3) Cut out egg shaped pop-ups on sheet 1A, along centre fold.
- 4) Push shapes out, so they stick out the front of page 1A.
- 5) Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page B.

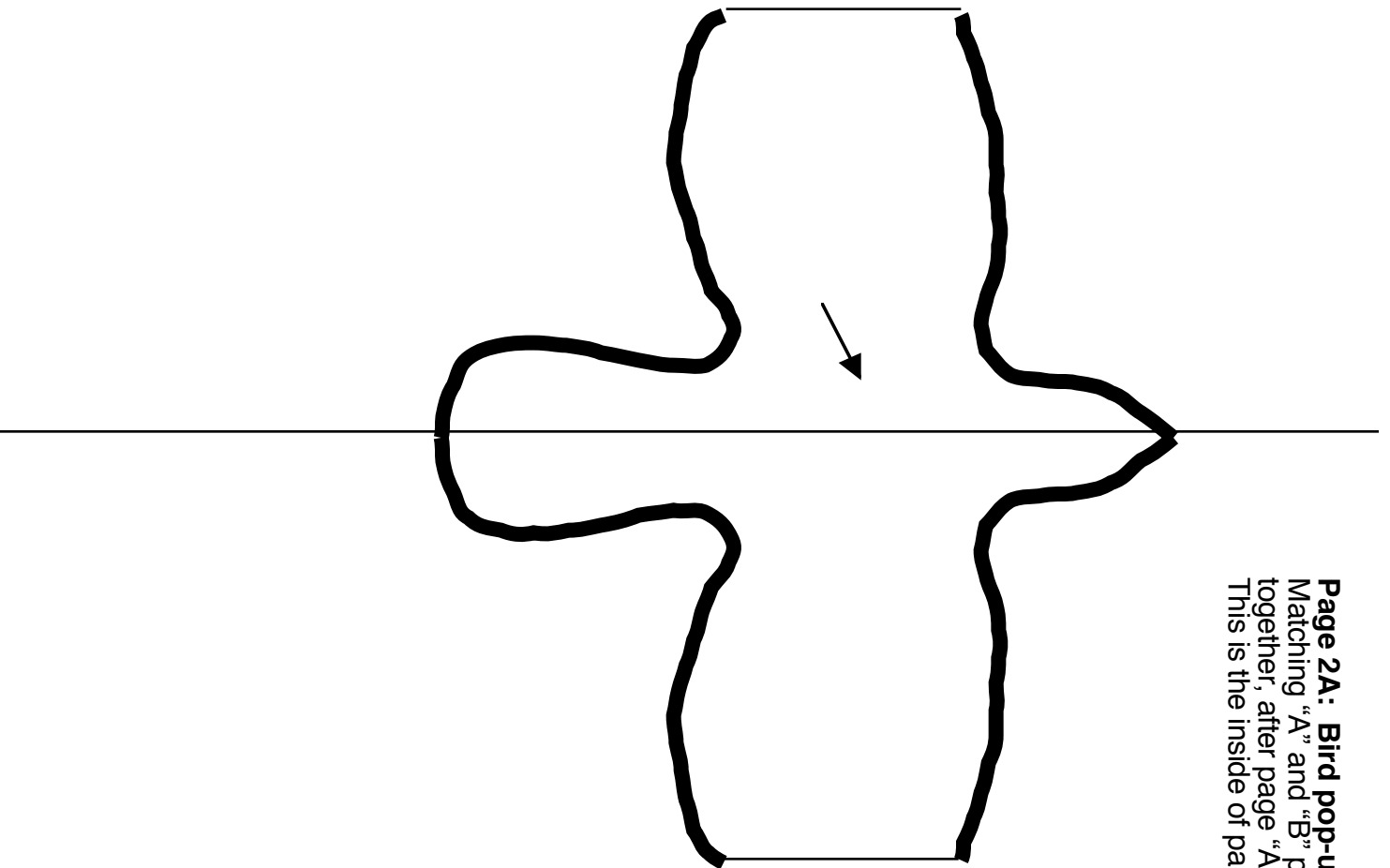

Page 2A: Bird pop-up
Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished.

Page 2B: Bird pop-up

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
- 2) Fold sheet 2A in half along fold line.
- 3) Cut out bird shaped pop-up on sheet 2A.
- 4) Push shape out, so it sticks out the front of page 2A.
- 5) Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page B.

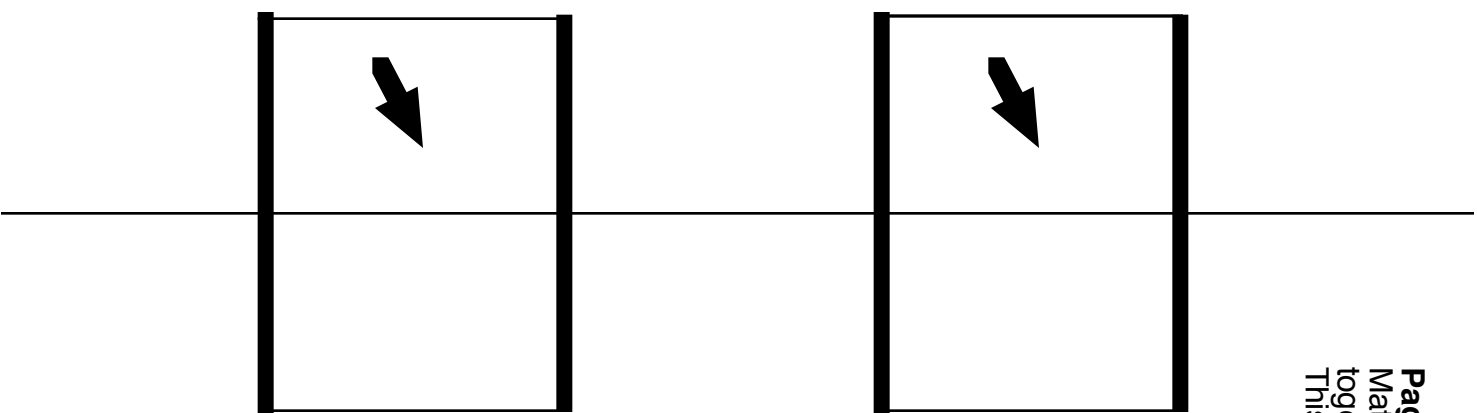

Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page A.

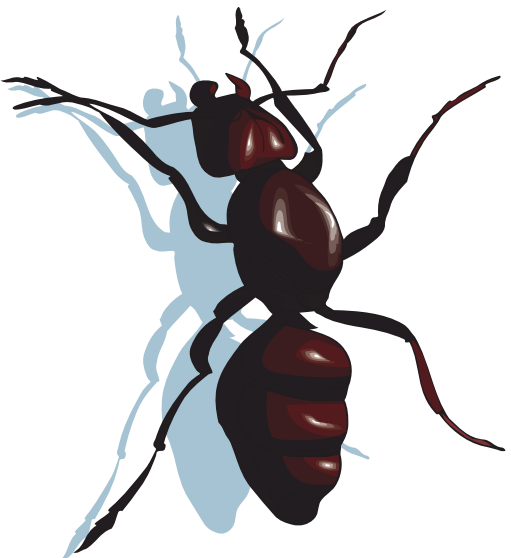

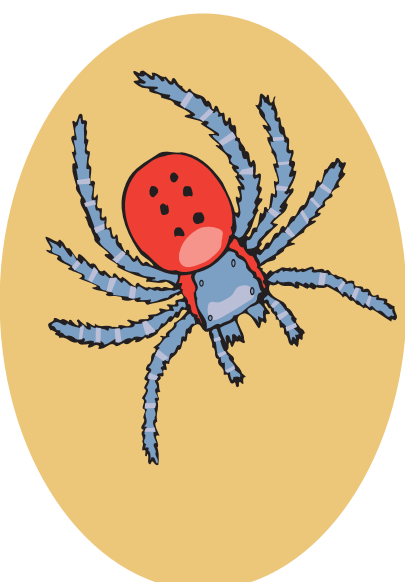


Page 3B : Bug pop-up

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
- 2) Fold sheet 3B in half along fold line.
- 3) Cut out pop-up boxes on sheet 3A.
- 4) Push boxes out, so they stick out the front of page 3A.
- 5) Draw 2 bugs on another sheet of paper, larger than one side of each pop-up box.
- 6) Glue one bug on one side of each pop-up box, so you have 2 bugs that pop up when you hold the page sideways.
- 5) Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page B.

There are some sample bugs on this page, but use your library!



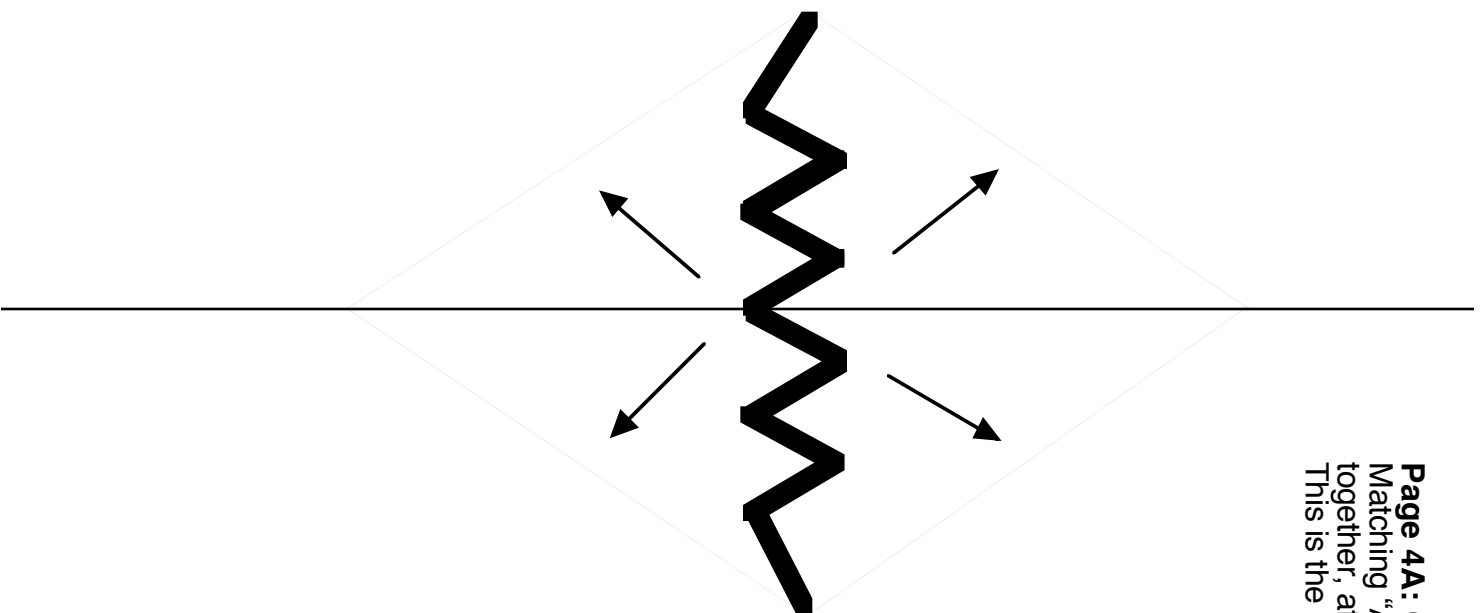

Page 4A: Crocodile pop-up
Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page A.



Page 4B: Crocodile pop-up

Directions:

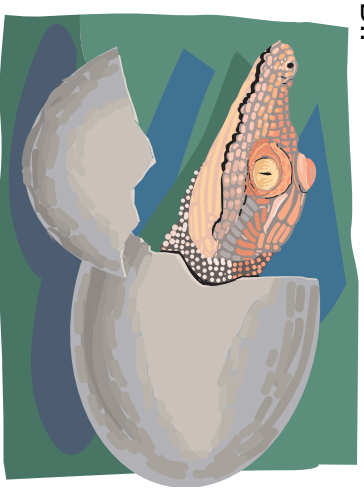
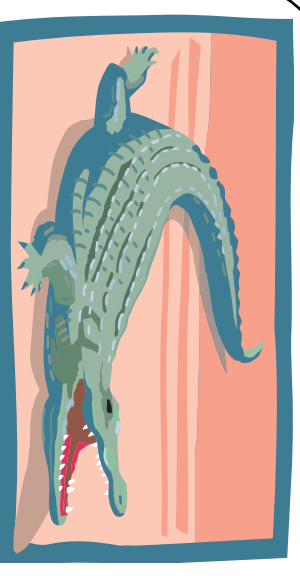
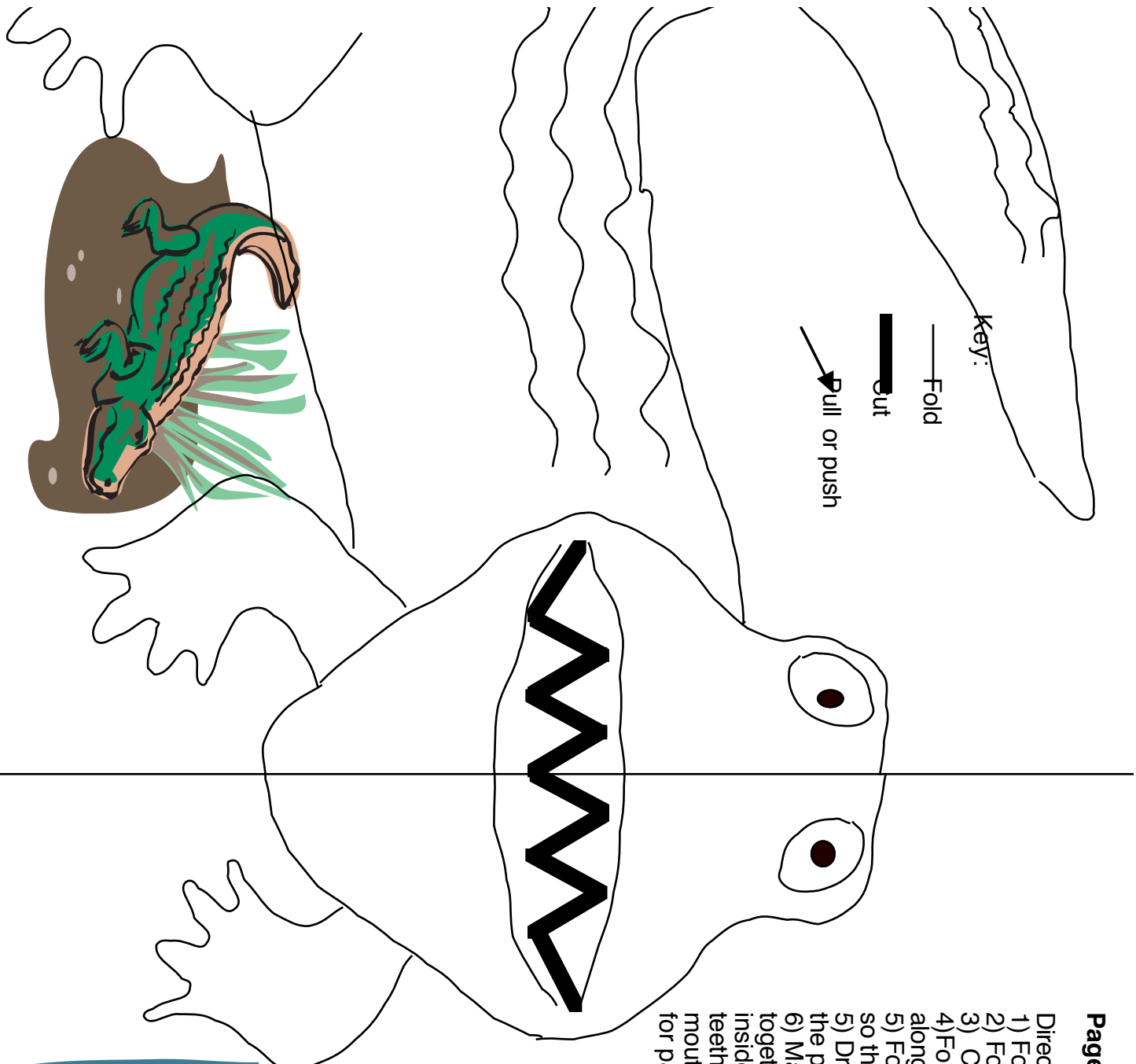
- 1) Fold this sheet in half along fold line.
- 2) Fold sheet 4A in half along fold line.
- 3) Cut out mouth pop-up on sheet 4A.
- 4) Fold upper and lower mouth parts flat along fold lines.
- 5) Fold back flat, and push mouth parts out, so they stick out the front of page 4A.
- 5) Draw a crocodile around the mouth, as in the pictures below.
- 6) Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page B (If you do not want the teeth on this page to show through the open mouth on page A, use a blank piece of paper for page B..

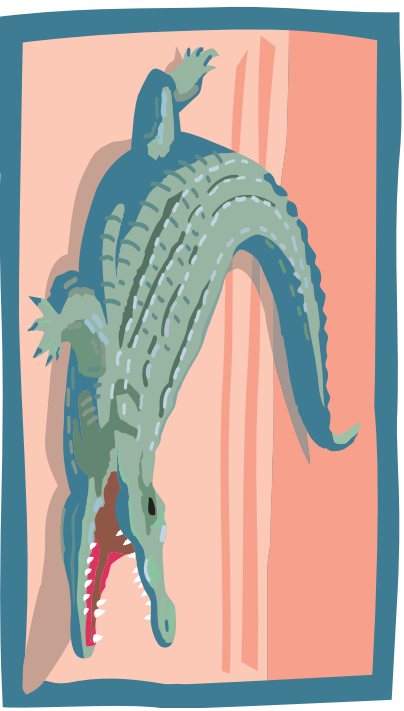


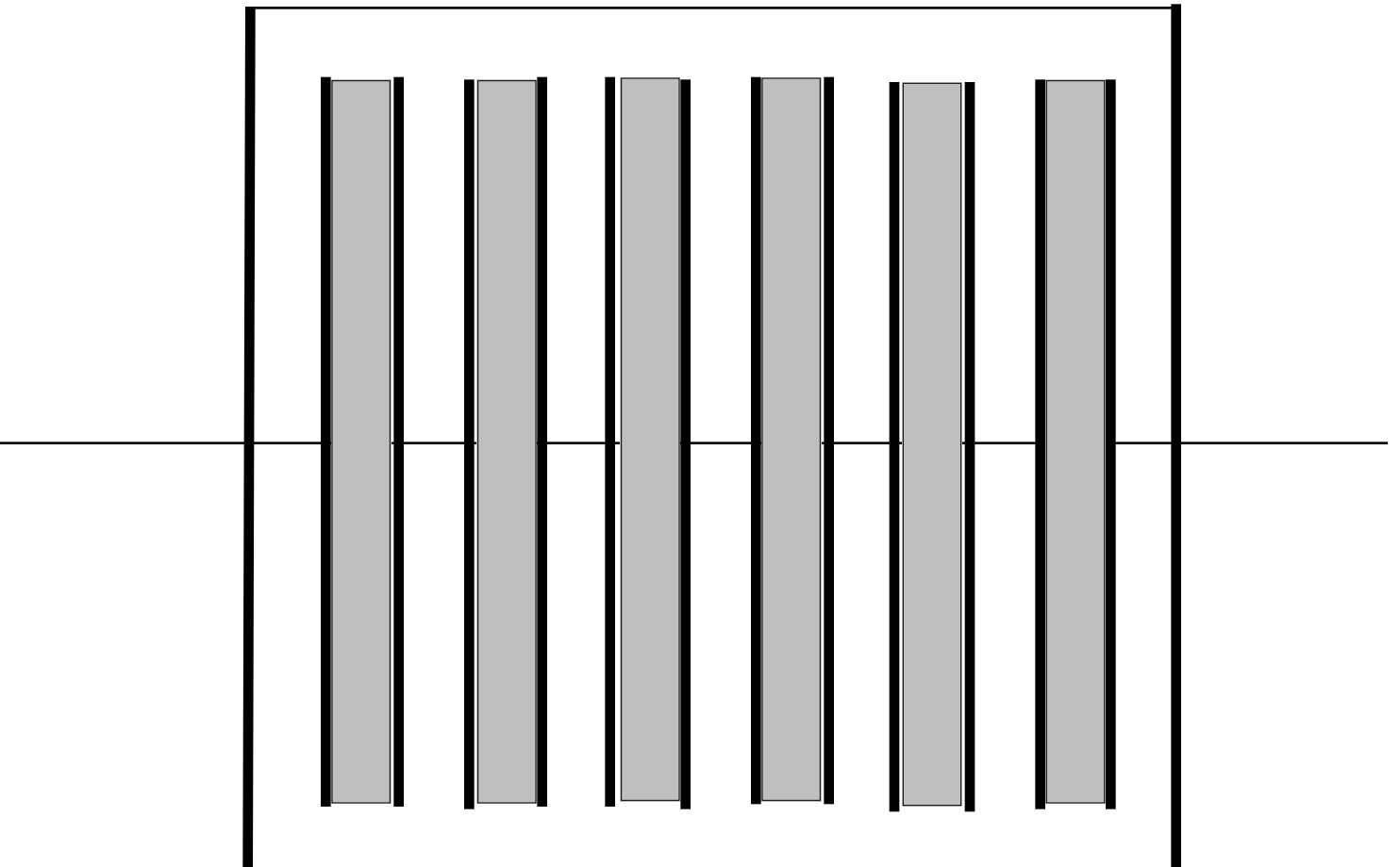
Page 5: Crocodile pop-up

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
- 3) Cut out pop-up box on this sheet.
- 4) Push box out, so it sticks out the front of this sheet (This side is the back of the sheet).
- 5) Draw a crocodile on another sheet of paper, larger than the pop-up box, but smaller than its cage on page 6.
- 6) Glue the crocodile on the pop-up box, so the crocodile pops up when you hold the page sideways.

There are some sample crocodiles on this page, but use your library!

Page 6B: Cage pop-up instructions

Directions:

- 1) Fold sheet 6A in half along fold line.
- 2) Cut along each cut line on the page
- 3) Fold the cage back along the fold line, and flatten it again.
- 4) Cut out the shaded sections to create bars for the cage.
- 5) Push the cage out, so it sticks out the front of the sheet, and stands out like a cage when you open the card.
- 6) Glue the cage over the crocodile on page 5, so she will not bite you!
- 7) This piece of paper is not part of your pop-up, so you can save it for scrap paper.

This cage concept was taken from one of the best books I know on how to make toy and movable books, by Joan Irvine (1987) called, "How to make pop-ups (p. 34-35)."

Page 7A: Snake pop-up

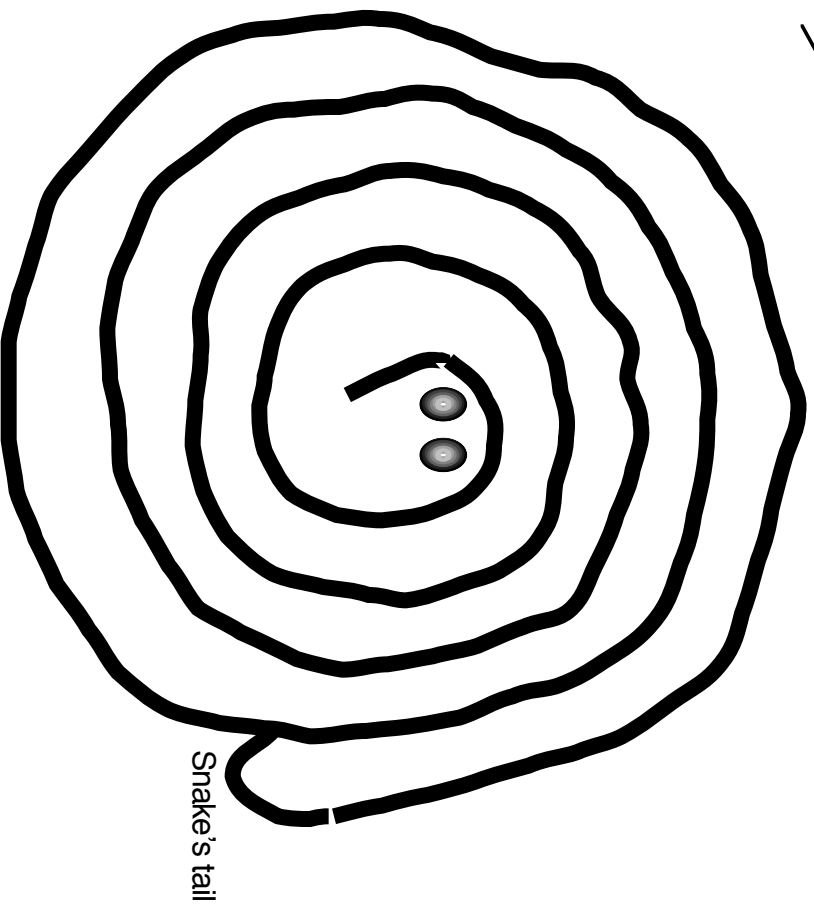
This is the inside of page A.
Glue the snake's tail on the side
opposite the "X."

Page 7B: Instructions and cut-out for snake pop-up

Directions:

- 1) Fold sheet 7A in half along fold line.
- 2) Color both sides of the snake.
- 3) Cut out snake spiral shape from this sheet.
- 4) Attach the snake's head to the other side of the sheet 7A, where the "x" is (the centre of one side of the sheet). The tail should be near the edge of the paper.
- 5) Add a spot of glue to the snake's tail and close the page.
- 6) Open up the page and see the snake move.
- 7) This piece of paper is not part of your pop-up, so you can save it for scrap paper.

base**

Page 8B: Snake accordion book

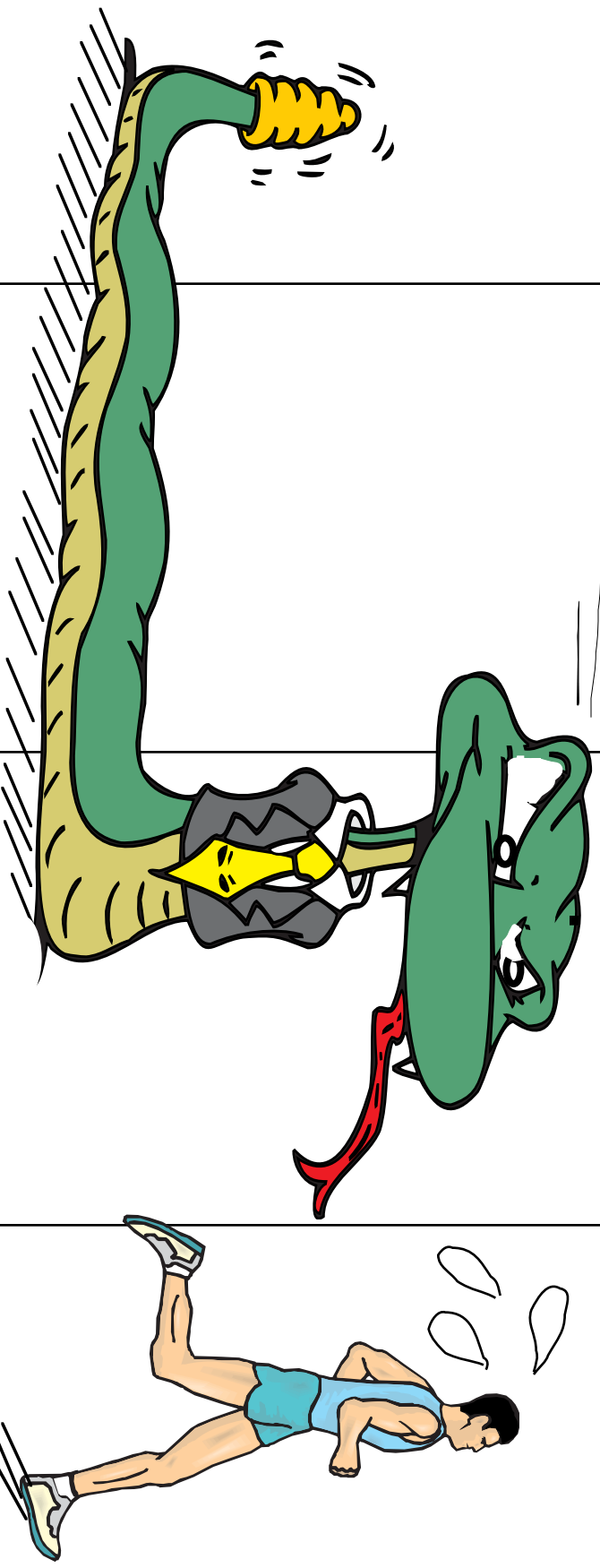

- Directions:
- 1) Fold this sheet along fold lines, to make an accordion book. The running man should be on the top page of the accordion book, so only he is seen when the book is folded up. When you unfold the book, you can see why the man is running!
 - 2) Fold sheet 1A in half along fold line.
 - 3) Glue this accordion book to the right side of page 8A, just on the flap that is labeled, "Glue down."
 - 4) Why not add a pop-up tongue on the snake?
 - 4) You can also make your own accordion book of a snake chasing a person, instead of using the pictures on this page.
 - 5) You can also cut the top of an accordion book, to make different shaped pages. Why not try egg shapes?

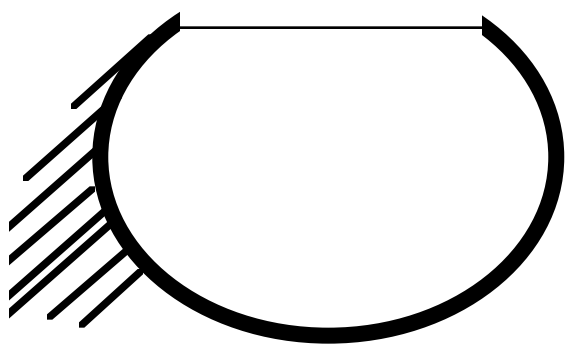
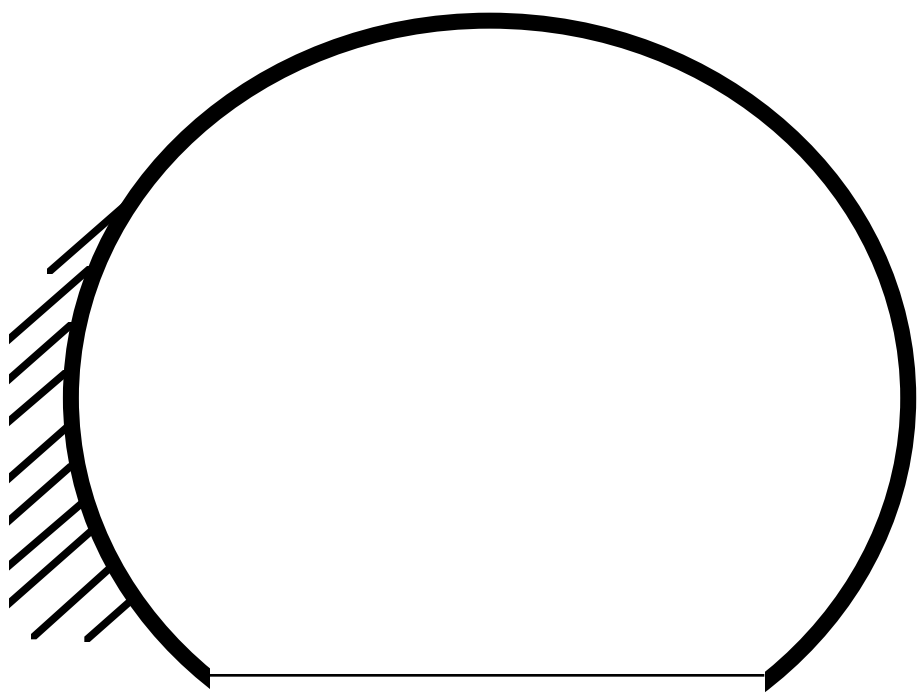

Page 9A: Egg “shape and feel” and “flap”
page Matching “A” and “B” pages are glued
together, after page “A” is finished.

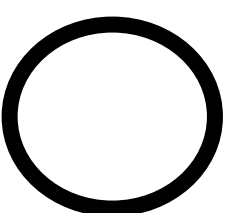
Page 9B : Egg “shape and feel” and “flap” page

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
- 2) Fold sheet 9A in half along fold line.
- 3) Cut out egg shaped flaps on sheet 9A.
- 4) Push both shapes out, so they stick out the front sheet 9A.
- 5) Matching “A” and “B” pages are glued together, after page “A” is finished. When you lift the flaps, the rabbit and the egg show “peek” through. This is the inside of page B.
- 6) To make this page a “shape and feel” page, glue a chocolate easter egg wrapper over the egg picture, or use tin foil, or glue some “fur” on the rabbit.
- 7) You can also draw your own rabbit and easter eggs, instead of using the pictures below.



**Page 10A: Hole and wheel page
(Optional)**
Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued
together, after page "A" is finished.
This is the front of page A.

Optional page 10B : Hole and wheel page (Optional)

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
 - 2) Fold sheet 10A in half along fold line.
 - 3) Cut out the hole on sheet 10A.
 - 4) Cut out the wheel on page 10C.
 - 5) Insert the wheel in-between page 10A and 10B, with a butterfly clip, with the dot on 10A and 10B being the centre of the wheel, so it hangs over the edge of this page.
 - 6) Glue pages A and B together, being careful to keep all glue away from the wheel.
- You can also draw your own pictures on a wheel, instead of using the pictures on the wheel on 10C.

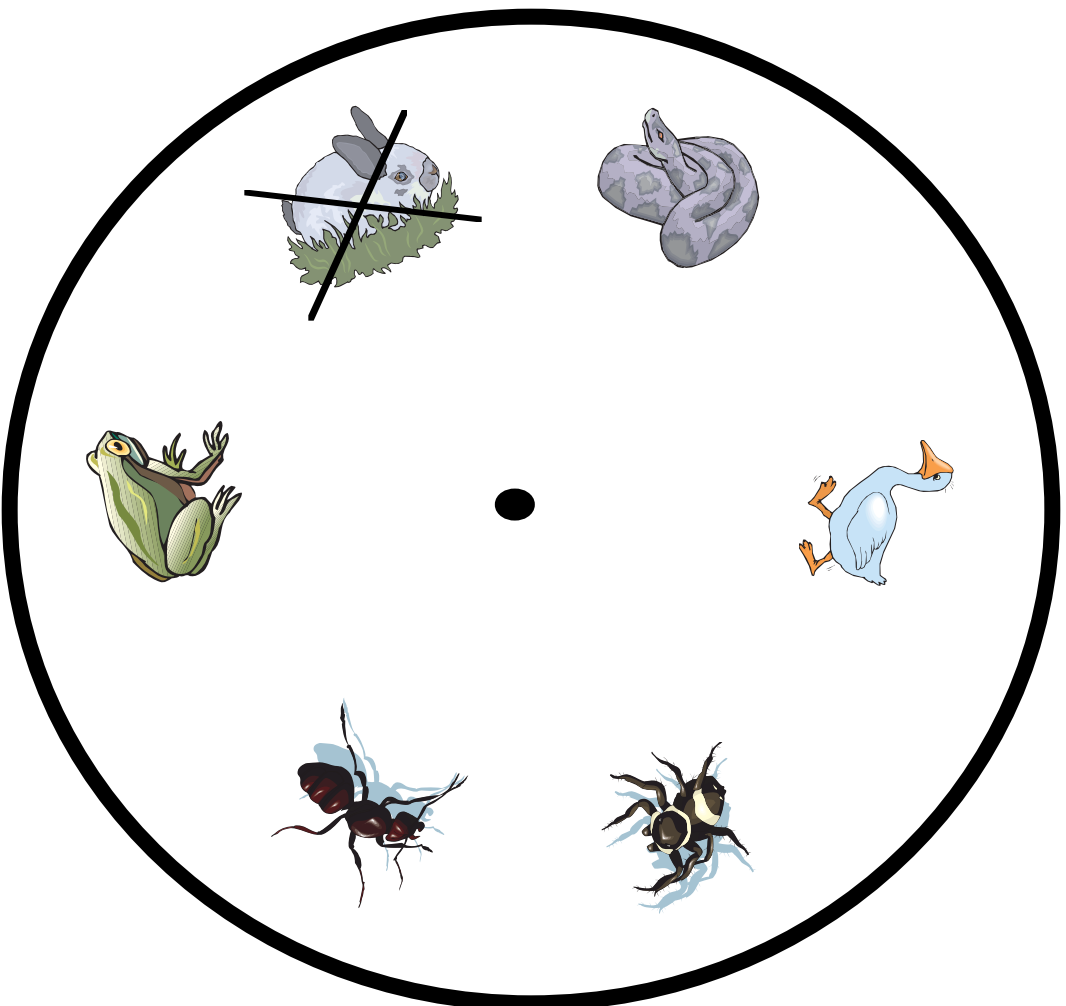


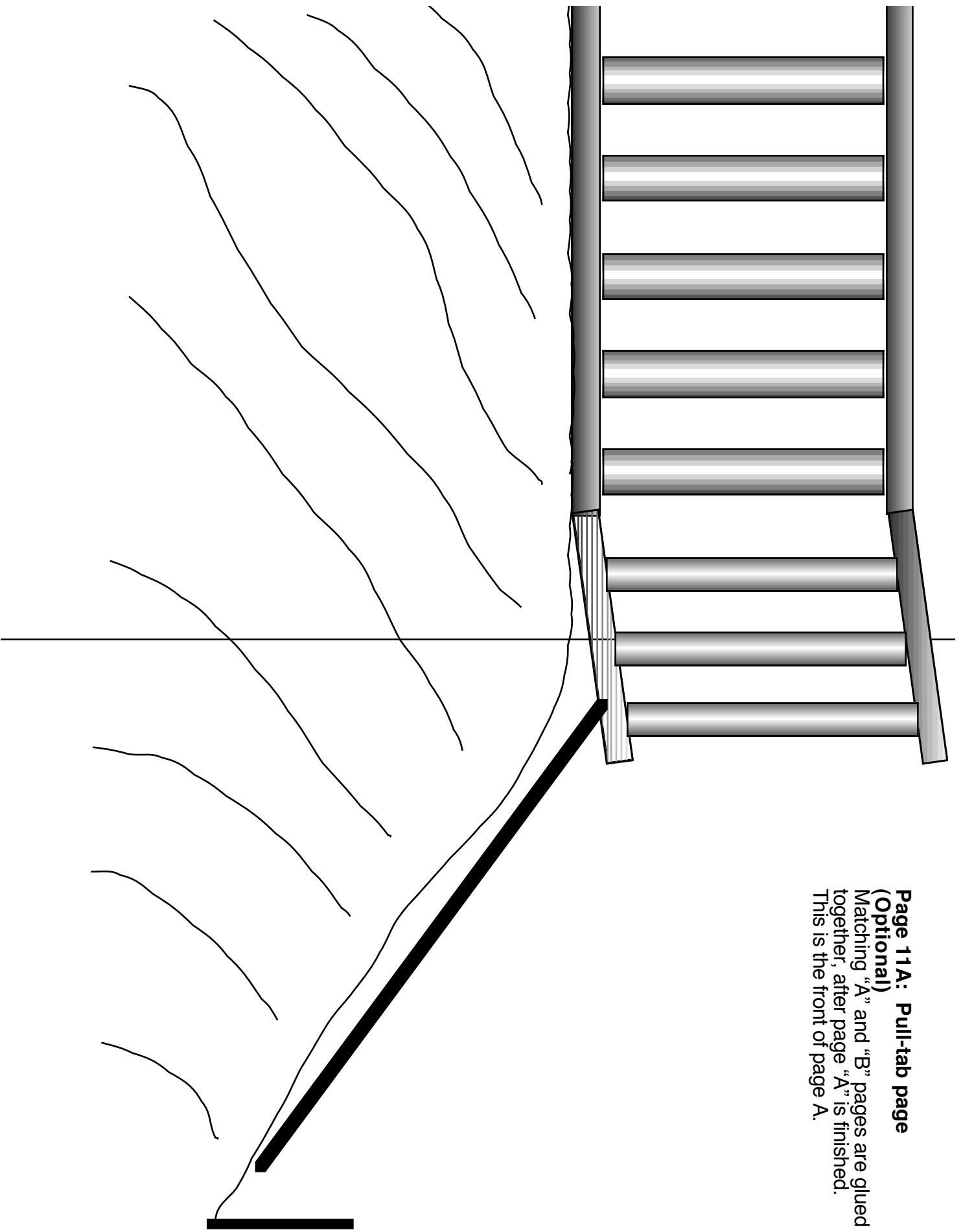

Page 11A: Pull-tab page (Optional)
Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished.
This is the front of page A.

Page 11B: Crocodile Pull-tab pop up (Optional)

Directions:

- 1) Fold this sheet along fold line.
- 2) Fold sheet 11A in half along fold line.
- 3) Cut out pull-tab and crocodile on sheet 11C, or draw your own crocodile.
- 4) Cut out along the 2 cut lines on page 11A.
- 5) Fold the tab over flat on the pull-tab, and insert it through the small cut line on page 11A. Pull the tab through the long cut-line, and glue the crocodile to the tab, so she is running down the hill, out of the cage.
- 5) Matching "A" and "B" pages are glued together, after page "A" is finished. This is the inside of page B.

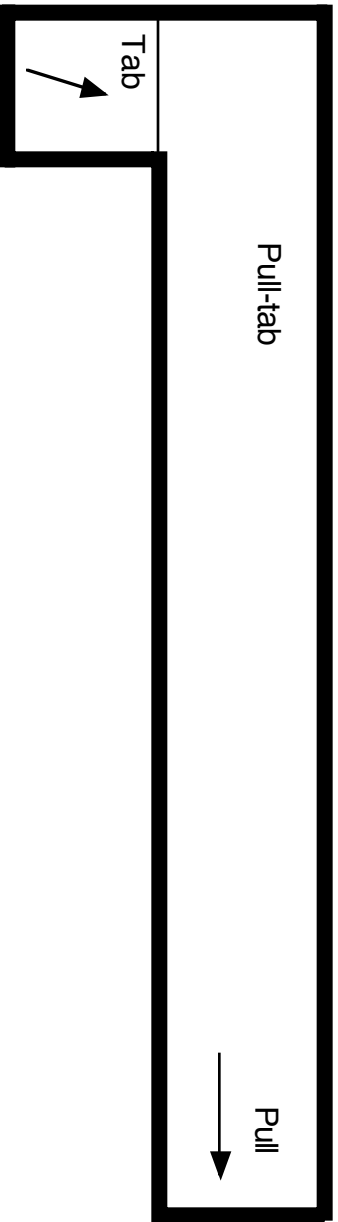
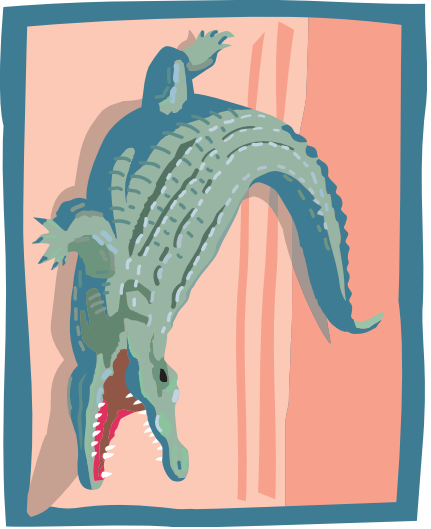
Page 11C: Crocodile Pull-tab and crocodile cut-outs (Optional)

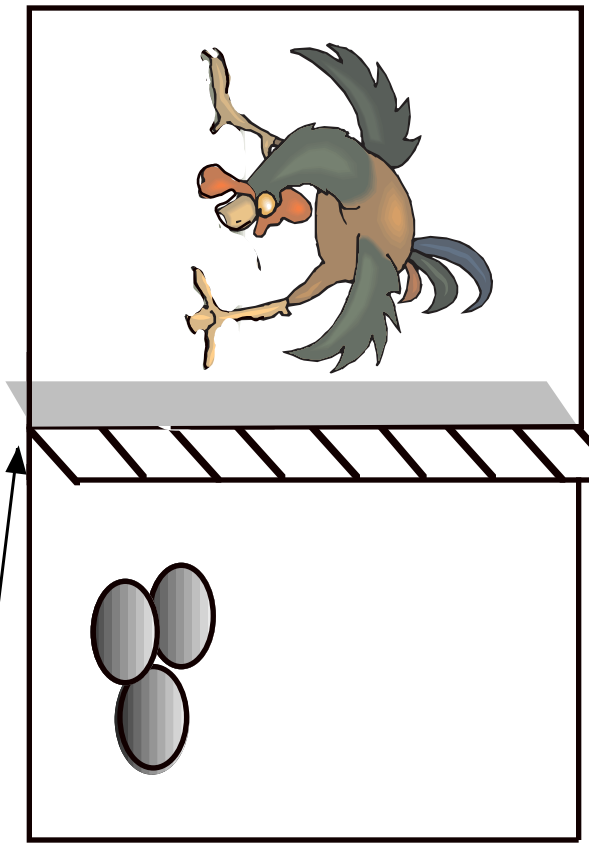

Cut a card the same size as the one on the opposite page, and hold it upright along this line that marks the bottom of the fence. Lower your face to the card, until your nose touches the upright card.



Page 12: Eye trick page (optional)
Help the chicken find her eggs:
Someone has moved the chicken's eggs to the other side of the fence, so she can not find them. Follow the directions on the opposite page, to reunite the chicken and her eggs.
