



Program of Studies: Bachelor of Management (B.Mgt.)

Calendar Year: 2009/2010

The Faculty of Management offers a four-year, 40-course program leading to the Bachelor of Management (B.Mgt.) degree. Within the B.Mgt. program, students may choose one of the following majors:

- Accounting
- Computer Science
- Economics
- Finance
- First Nations' Governance
- General Management
- Human Resource Management and Labour Relations
- Information Systems
- International Management
- Marketing
- Political Science

Admission Requirements

Admission to the Faculty of Management may occur at the second-year level and is based on the following requirements:

- ECON 1010 - Introduction to Microeconomics (St. Mary's: ECON 201)
- ECON 1012 - Introduction to Macroeconomics (St. Mary's: ECON 203)
- STAT 1770 - Introduction to Probability and Statistics (St. Mary's: STAT 213)
- Seven Arts and Science or Fine Arts courses (21.0 credit hours)

Admission to Management programs is competitive and is based on academic achievement prior to admission with a minimum combined cumulative grade point average at or above the current admission cut-off. The grade point average is calculated on all completed transferable post-secondary courses.

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in Statistics 1770; Economics 1010 and Economics 1012; Writing 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses; and all courses in the major marked with an asterisk (*) in the UofL Calendar in order to meet degree requirements.

Minors

Minors in Information Systems and Social Responsibility are available to all majors (except Information Systems where the minor in Information Systems is not available) in the Bachelor of Management degree, Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management degree, Management Certificate, B.A./B.Mgt., B.Sc./B.Mgt., B.Mgt./B.Ed., Post-Diploma B.Mgt./B.Ed., and second degrees in Management. In some cases, achievement of the minor and a chosen major will require a student to take extra courses. For students who complete all the requirements, the minor will be acknowledged on the official transcript (see Part II - Faculty of Management in the 2009/2010 Calendar).

Note: Several policies and academic regulations may influence a student's choice of courses at St. Mary's University College. The Bachelor of Management program generally may include a maximum of 10 introductory (1000-level) courses. Residence requirements demand that students complete 20 courses at the University of Lethbridge, including 10 Management courses at the 3000/4000 level (see page 2 of this guide for more information).

St. Mary's University College students are encouraged to concentrate on completing the required Arts and Science courses and electives necessary for admission to the Faculty of Management prior to application to the University of Lethbridge, as sequenced on pages 2-3 of this guide. Please consult the 2009/2010 University of Lethbridge Calendar and page 4 of this guide for further information on Arts and Science Electives and the University of Lethbridge's General Liberal Education Requirement.

SUGGESTED SEQUENCING PLAN

Bachelor of Management

Shown below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. Students intending to pursue a specific major should also consult the Notes for Specific Majors on the following page.

This is one example of how you could complete courses which transfer to the University of Lethbridge. If you wish to follow a different sequence, please contact the Student Services Office at St. Mary's University College before registration.

Residence Requirement: All students must complete at least 20 University of Lethbridge courses, 10 of which must be 3000/4000-level Management courses. Exceptions apply to certain majors for the ten 3000/4000-level Management courses required for residency. Students in the following majors may use courses in the major towards this requirement: Computer Science majors can use 3000/4000-level Computer Science courses in addition to 3000/4000-level Management courses; Economics majors can use 3000/4000-level Economics courses in addition to 3000/4000-level Management courses; First Nations' Governance majors can use 3000/4000-level Native American Studies courses in addition to 3000/4000-level Management courses; and Political Science majors can use 3000/4000-level Political Science courses in addition to 3000/4000-level Management courses.

TERMS USED

GLER course: A course that could count toward the General Liberal Education Requirement. You may use courses in your major toward this 12-course requirement. See the 2009/2010 University of Lethbridge Calendar, Part 4 - Academic Regulations (pp. 89-92) for complete information.

Elective: A course that you may choose freely from all those available to you.

NOTES FOR SPECIFIC MAJORS

This page outlines issues concerning each specific major in the B.Mgt. program. Generally, St. Mary's University College students are advised to include certain courses in their program, if possible, prior to transferring to the University of Lethbridge. The notes about the majors should be considered in addition to the General Notes on the previous page.

Accounting

Year 1: Include MATH 211 (UofL: MATH 1410) or MATH 249 or 251 (MATH 1560) and STAT 217 (STAT 2780) to replace two GLER courses (Science).

Year 2: Students are advised to transfer to the UofL after Year 1, Winter.

Computer Science

This major requires courses in Computer Science that are not available at St. Mary's University College. Students are advised to attend the University of Lethbridge if they are interested in completing a major in Computer Science.

Economics

Year 1: Include MATH 249 or 251 (UofL: MATH 1560) and STAT 217 (STAT 2780) to replace two GLER courses (Science).

Year 2: Include ECON 301 (ECON 3010) and ECON 303 (ECON 3012) to replace the GLER course (Social Science) and a 3000/4000-level elective. Economics majors may choose to include a non-Management elective to replace the GLER course (Science).

Finance

Year 1: Include MATH 249 or 251 (UofL: MATH 1560) and STAT 217 (STAT 2780) to replace two GLER courses (Science).

Year 2: Finance majors may choose to include two non-Management electives to replace the GLER course (Social Science) and the GLER course (Science).

First Nations' Governance

This major requires courses in Native American Studies that are not available at St. Mary's University College. Students are advised to attend the University of Lethbridge if they are interested in completing a major in First Nations' Governance.

General Management

Use standard pattern.

Human Resource Management and Labour Relations

Year 1: Use standard pattern.

Year 2: Include either PSYC 201 (UofL: PSYC 1000) to replace the GLER course (Science) or SOCI 201 (SOCI 1000) to replace the GLER course (Social Science).

Information Systems

Year 1: Include STAT 217 (UofL: STAT 2780) to replace a GLER course (Science). Information Systems majors may choose to include a non-Management elective to replace one GLER course (Science).

Year 2: Include an elective that transfers to the UofL at the 3000/4000 level to replace a non-Management elective. Information Systems majors may choose to include two non-Management electives to replace the GLER course (Science) and the GLER course (Social Science).

International Management

Year 1: International Management majors must complete a four-course Language Minor. Include a GLER course (Social Science or Science) to replace the non-Management elective. Students should choose a language and take transferable language courses to replace two GLER courses (Fine Arts and Humanities). Students may choose French or Spanish. FREN 209 (UofL: FREN 1000) and FREN 211 (FREN 1100) may not be taken for credit by students with French 30, 31, or equivalent. FREN 219 (FREN 1500) may not be taken for credit by students with French Language Arts 30 or Français 30 or equivalent. SPAN 201 (SPAN 1000) and SPAN 203 (SPAN 1100) may not be taken for credit by students with Spanish 30 or equivalent.

Year 2: Students are advised to transfer to the UofL after Year 1, Winter.

Marketing

Year 1: Include PSYC 201 (UofL: PSYC 1000) and STAT 217 (STAT 2780) to replace two GLER courses (Science).

Year 2: Include SOCI 201 (SOCI 1000) and an elective that transfers to the UofL at the 3000/4000 level to replace the GLER course (Social Science) and the GLER course (Science).

Political Science

Year 1: Include POLI 201 (UofL: POLI 1000) and a course that transfers as POLI at the 2000/3000/4000 level to replace a GLER course (Fine Arts and Humanities) and the non-Management elective.

Year 2: Include a GLER course (Fine Arts and Humanities), a course that transfers as POLI at the 2000/3000/4000 level, and a course that transfers as POLI at the 3000/4000 level to replace the GLER course (Social Science) and two 3000/4000-level electives.

GENERAL LIBERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

The General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER) is a 12-course requirement (36.0 credit hours) for all University of Lethbridge undergraduate students. It is based on the liberal education philosophy of the University and is designed to ensure that students acquire breadth of knowledge encompassing a wide range of disciplines.

While the GLER must be completed by the time of graduation, it is strongly recommended that students meet the GLER within their first two years. You must complete four transferable courses (12.0 credit hours) from each of the following three groups (Note: Transferable courses are given as per the 2009/2010 Alberta Transfer Guide; refer to the online Alberta Transfer Guide at transferalberta.ca for the most up-to-date information):

Notes

- A maximum of four courses (12.0 credit hours) from one department may be used in meeting the General Liberal Education Requirement. Please refer to the 2009/2010 University of Lethbridge Calendar for complete information regarding this requirement.
- Psychology 1000 is normally designated as a Science course, but may be designated as a Social Science upon admission according to what is most advantageous to the student, or after admission upon application to the Registrar's Office and Student Services (ROSS) at the UofL.
- Courses that transfer as unspecified Arts and Science courses will be designated as belonging to one of the three lists, based on the content of the course. This designation will be done by the Admissions Office at the University of Lethbridge upon admission.
