This study theme provides for an innovative program that explores current research in neuroscience and how it can improve teaching and learning within inclusive classrooms. This program brings together the well-regarded expertise of the University of Lethbridge programs in Education and Neuroscience.

Mode of Delivery: This program will use a blended delivery model – online courses during the school year with occasional face-to-face meetings plus three-week face-to-face summer sessions in July in Lethbridge.

Costs: - A quality program for a reasonable cost – approximately \$10,000 – in accordance with University regulations for a Master of Education degree.

Courses: A total of 12 course equivalents.

Four Core: (tailored to focus on inclusion, learning disabilities, behaviour disorders, neuroscience, etc.)

- Research
- Curriculum
- Professional learning
- Foundations of theory and practice in education

Study Theme courses addressing such topics as:

- Inclusive education
- Neuroscience research and brain-based teaching
- Neurobiology and learning differences
- Behaviour disorders
- Learning disabilities
- Differentiating curriculum and instruction for students with special learning needs
- Neurological and psychoeducational assessment of learning and behaviour
- Assistive technology
- Accessible instructional resources
- Working effectively with students with special needs and their families
- Leadership and managing change in inclusive schools
- Literacy within an inclusive classroom

Graduate Practicum: Students will complete a graduate practicum to address individual professional interests.

Culminating Activity: Students may choose the mode of program completion as capstone, project, or thesis.
