Residence	A minimum of 15 courses (45.0 credit hours) extra to the first degree, including ten 3000/4000-level Management courses, must be completed at the University of Lethbridge.

Courses completed as part of a first degree may be used as advance credit in the Bachelor of Management as a second degree.
