FACULTY OF EDUCATION ADMISSION
Admission to the Faculty of Education requires successful completion of the following:
20 semester courses ( 60.0 credit hours).
Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U ofL and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 courses ( 60.0 credit hours).

Minimum major course requirement:
$\qquad$ Eight courses ( 24.0 credit hours) in the single discipline major
Eleven courses ( 33.0 credit hours) in the 15 -course multidisciplinary major, including at least five courses ( 15.0 credit hours) in the main teaching subject area
Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.
Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - O rientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor. Students who do not receive a favourable recommendation for admission to the Faculty of Education may be permitted to reenroll in the course after one full year provided they can demonstrate that they have sufficiently remediated inadequacies in their previous performance.
This is an introductory Education course with a supervised field experience component to assist students in making a decision concerning admission into the Faculty of Education and to assist the Faculty in determining the appropriateness of the student's admission. It is offered regularly each semester. The field experience component consists of two three-hour or three two-hour blocks of time in the morning for student practicum in school classrooms.
Prerequisites for Education 2500: Second-year standing (a minimum of 30.0 credit hours) AN D a GPA of 2.50, calculated on all University of Lethbridge and transferable courses.
__- W riting Proficiency Requirement:
Demonstrated proficiency in written and oral English by the June 1 document deadline. A student may meet the W riting Proficiency Requirement in any of the following ways:

- obtaining a grade of 75 percent or higher on the English Language Arts 30-1 Alberta Diploma exam
- obtaining a final grade of 80 percent or higher in English Language Arts 30-1 or its equivalent from any province
- passing the Alberta Universities' W riting Competence Test (AUWCT)
- obtaining a pass in the 'W riting for University' course
- obtaining a grade of ' B ' ( 3.00 on a 4.0 scale) or higher in W riting 1000
- obtaining a grade of ' B ' ( 3.00 on a 4.0 scale) or higher in a university English course
- successful completion of a recognized degree from an English-language university

Students are encouraged to consult early with the Faculty of Education, Student Program Services 0 ffice regarding procedures for meeting the W riting Proficiency Requirement.

Specific major requirements (if applicable):
a. Dramatic Arts - completion of an acceptable portfolio, performance audition and interview.
b. Music - completion of an acceptable performance audition and/or interview.
c. Native Education - completion of five of the seven courses required in the school subject minor. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 out of 4.0 is required on all graded courses comprising the minor.*
d. Physical Education - completion of a Physical Education and Sport Activities report.

* Some minors have additional admission requirements.

_-_ Application to the Faculty of Education (see www.uleth.ca/ross/admissions/deadlines.html for application and document deadlines). Application forms may be picked up at and submitted to the Registrar's $O$ ffice and Student Services (RO SS) (SU 140; tel. 403-320-5700).
Students should note that completion of pre-Education requirements does not guarantee admission to the Faculty of Education. The enrolment limit is no rmally 216 , with 16 positions for each major. For qualified applicants admission decisions are based primarily on evaluation of performance in Education 2500, a writing proficiency requirement, and grade point average calculated on all UofL and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 university-level courses ( 60.0 credit hours), including courses in a previous degree and courses taken subsequently. The Faculty of Education has an admission policy for students of A boriginal descent and students with a significant shift in academic performance (see the current C alendar for more information).
