The Bachelor of Management degree in International Management is a minimum of 40 courses in length. Admission to the Faculty may occur at the end of Year One. Students are required to have completed the following courses, with a minimum cumulative grade point average at or above the current admission cut-off (2.50 for Fall 2003):

- Economics 1010 (2001)
- Economics 1012 (2000)
- Statistics 1770
- Any seven Arts and Science courses at the 1000/2000 level

Students are also cautioned to examine the course sequencing on the reverse side of this Program Planning Guide in order to include the appropriate courses in Year One. Admission to Management programs is competitive and is based on academic achievement prior to admission.

**Minimum Grade Requirement**

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in Statistics 1770, Economics 1010 and 1012, Writing 1000 OR a university English course and all Management courses in order to meet degree requirements.

**Note:** If the University does not offer a sufficient number of courses to meet the four-course language requirement, the student may obtain permission from the Faculty of Management to attend other institutions in order to fulfill their language requirements and credit will be approved toward the University of Lethbridge degree. The International Management major includes an international exchange semester. In general, a student may not select his or her country of origin as the country of study, and may not select his or her native language as the language of study.

\* Prerequisite: Mathematics 30 or Pure Mathematics 30, or Applied Mathematics 30 and at least 75% standing in Athabasca University's Mathematics 101.

### FACULTY OF MANAGEMENT CAMPUSES

The Faculty of Management offers courses on three campuses: Lethbridge, Calgary and Edmonton. On the Calgary and Edmonton campuses the University of Lethbridge guarantees only those courses that form part of the programs/majors identified below:

- Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management, Accounting
- Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management, General Management
- Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management, Qualifying Program

Students may opt to take Summer Session courses which may reduce the overall length of time required to complete the degree.

Sequencing of courses will vary for part-time students.

All course in this major may not be offered every semester. Students should consult current Timetables.
