Students with previous degrees, other than the degree Bachelor of Commerce or its equivalent, may pursue the Bachelor of Management as a second degree. Admission to Management programs is competitive and is based on academic achievement prior to admission. Second degree programs consist of the Arts and Science and 2000-level Management courses required for the chosen major, the Management core courses and the specific 3000/4000-level Management and Arts and Science courses that are required for the chosen major. The Undergraduate Programs Office in the Faculty of Management (E480) will review previous educational background and design a program at the time of admission. The program will consist of a maximum of 20 courses.

Once you have received notification of the courses that will be required, consult the University Calendar and Timetables. Note that, depending upon previous educational background and chosen major, a Bachelor of Management as a Second Degree may require more than four semesters to complete.

**Residence Requirement:** A minimum of 15 courses, including 10 3000/4000-level Management courses, must be completed at the University of Lethbridge, extra to the first degree, in order to satisfy the residence requirement.
