## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

## PURPOSE OF NCLEX-RN ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The NESA BN Programs is committed to supporting the success of our graduates on the NCLEX-RN registration examination; therefore, we seek to provide students with learning opportunities and resources that assist them in preparing to successfully write this examination.

The NCLEX-RN Advisory Committee will support the planning and delivery of practice NCLEX-RN examinations each semester (e.g. HESI Exit Examinations), monitor student performance on these examinations, and will share these results with other NESA Committees such as the NESA Curriculum Coordinating Committee and Program Evaluation Committee. This committee will also examine NCLEX-RN resources and learning opportunities, which may support NESA BN Programs graduate success on this exam, and will make recommendations for the incorporation of these resources and opportunities to the appropriate NESA committee.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- The NCLEX-RN Advisory Committee will support the implementation of ongoing strategies for NCLEX-RN success including:
  - Maintain a long-term Moodle course for NESA students to share relevant NCLEX-RN preparation and remediation resources.
  - Monitor NCLEX-RN results for performance trends, evaluate potential resources for NCLEX-RN
    preparation, and make recommendations for inclusion in the Moodle support course or within the
    curriculum at large.
- 2. The NCLEX-RN Advisory Committee will support the planning and delivery of practice examinations to improve student performance on the NCLEX-RN exam including:
  - Organize and deliver practice NCLEX-RN examinations (e.g. HESI Exit exams) each semester with students participating in their final clinical practicum (NURS 4750)
  - Monitor practice examination trends and communicate these trends with NESA Curriculum Coordinating Committee (CCC) and NESA Program Evaluation Committee (PEC, by forwarding the examination reports after each testing cycle to these committees.

<u>MEMBERSHIP</u>

**Chair:** To be selected by the committee, for a term of no longer than two years,

renewable once.

**Membership:** Minimum of four to a maximum of six faculty members, representative of both

institutions, and one student representative nominated by the University of

Lethbridge Nursing Student Association.

Term: September 1 – August 31 normally for a two-year term, renewable once.

Changes to committee membership to be determined each year in May at NESA BN Programs Joint Faculty meeting.

The committee reports to the NESA BN Programs Joint Faculty, with responsibilities to communicate with NESA CCC and PEC committees. Reporting:
