Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art

This Program Transfer Guide is designed to help you plan your transfer program to the University of Lethbridge. The information should help you keep track of your progress. Please remember that this is only a guide. It must be used in conjunction with the Grande Prairie Regional College and University of Lethbridge Calendars and the Alberta Transfer Guide, which are the final authorities on all questions regarding program requirements and admission to University of Lethbridge programs. Students are also advised to consult the University of Lethbridge program planning tools available online at www.uleth.ca/ross/programs.

Admission Requirements

If you have completed three or more transferable term courses, you are considered to be a New Transfer applicant. Admission requirements vary depending on the number of transferable, post-secondary courses completed. Application and Document Deadlines

You are encouraged to apply well ahead of the application deadlines. For detailed information, please visit our website www.uleth.ca/ross/admissions/apply or contact the Admissions Office at the U of L (SU140 | phone: 403-382-7134). Admission decisions are based on the information available at the time the application is reviewed. Conditional Offers of Admission may be issued in anticipation of fulfillment of the admission requirements by the appropriate deadline. Courses taken in the summer term that immediately precedes your admission to the fall term at the U of L must be complete before the start of the term and will be used to determine a final admission GPA.

Transfer Credit

Transfer credit is awarded upon admission to the U of L as per the Alberta Transfer Guide (transferalberta.alberta.ca) or U of L Transfer Credit Equivalencies Database (www.uleth.ca/ted). The minimum grade required for a course to be transferred to the U of L is a 'D'.

Unspecified course credit (1xxx, 2xxx, etc.) means that the University of Lethbridge does not offer the same course you transferred in, but we recognize and treat it as a university-level course. An unspecified course may not meet a specific course requirement. For example, if ART 2031 is required in your program, you may not use ART 2xxx to fulfill that requirement. Please contact an Academic Advisor in the Faculty of Fine Arts for more information.

Year of Calendar

A student admitted to a program offered by the U of L is governed by program requirements of the University Calendar in effect at the time of admission. If you wish to follow the program requirements of an earlier Calendar, contact your Faculty Student Program Services upon admission to the U of L.

Degree Requirements

Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art

1. Successful completion of 40 courses (120.0 credit hours) with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.00.
2. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 in all Art, Art History, and Museum Studies courses.
3. Completion of four courses from each of List II: Social Sciences and List III: Sciences to fulfill the Liberal Education List Requirement.
4. At least 13 Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies courses (39.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level.
5. A maximum of five Independent Studies (15.0 credit hours).
6. Not more than 10 courses may be taken at the 0100/1000 level for credit toward the degree. Activity courses and courses numbered in the range of 0520 to 0530 are exempted from this limit.
7. Residence requirement: 20 courses (60.0 credit hours), including a minimum of 12 offered by the Department of Art of which at least seven must be at the 3000/4000 level.
8. Completion of a minimum of 27 (81.0 credit hours) Art, Art History, and Museum Studies courses for Art Studio majors and a minimum of 25 (75.0 credit hours) Art, Art History, and Museum Studies courses for Art History/Museum Studies majors to a maximum of 32 courses in Art, Art History, and Museum Studies.

Liberal Education List Requirement (Lib Ed Requirement)

The Liberal Education List Requirement (Lib Ed Requirement) is a 12-course requirement (36.0 credit hours) for all University of Lethbridge undergraduate students. It is based on the liberal education philosophy of the University and is designed to ensure that students acquire breadth of knowledge encompassing a wide range of disciplines. The Lib Ed Requirement must be completed by the time of graduation. To meet the Lib Ed Requirement, you must complete four courses (12.0 credit hours) from each of the following three groups that will also meet degree requirements. See the appropriate faculty/school sections in the University of Lethbridge Calendar and Course Catalogue for a listing of the disciplines that pertain to each faculty/school and program. Courses required for the major and/or minor may be used to satisfy the Lib Ed Requirement. If a Grand Prairie Regional College course is being used to meet the Lib Ed Requirement, it must transfer appropriately as indicated below.

For **Combined Degrees programs with Education**, Lib Ed Requirement courses transferring as ABHL, ADCS, CDEV, CRED, HLSC, MGT, NURS, PUBH, or TREC may *only* count towards the degree requirements in the B.Mgt./B.Ed. program.

- Only four courses (12.0 credit hours) in total may be counted from any one discipline toward the Liberal Education List Requirement. Disciplines are identified by separate course subject codes at the University of Lethbridge. Only four courses (12.0 credit hours) in total from the Faculty of Education (EDUC), Faculty of Health Sciences (ABHL, ADCS, HLSC, NURS, PUBH, and TREC), and the Dhillon School of Business (MGT) may be counted towards the Liberal Education List Requirement. Please refer to the 2018/2019 University of Lethbridge Calendar and Course Catalogue for complete information regarding this requirement.
- Courses that transfer as unspecified Arts and Science courses will be designated as belonging to one of the three lists, based on the content of the course.

Co-operative Education

Co-operative Education is a program that integrates academic studies with relevant, full-time work experience. During work terms that are typically four months long, students gain practical experience in not-for-profit organizations, private industry or government agencies. Students may complete up to six work terms. Further information may be obtained from Career Bridge - Co-operative Education & Applied Studies (AH151; 403-329-2000; artsci.coop@uleth.ca; www.ulethbridge.ca/career-bridge).

Co-operative Education is an option for students in all programs offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts. Students interested in pursuing Co-operative Education are strongly encouraged to meet with an academic advisor in the Faculty of Fine Arts to discuss course sequencing implications if work terms are to be taken in the fall and/or spring terms.

Discipline Content

The Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art offers a perfect opportunity to immerse yourself in Art. Within the context of a liberal education degree, the program provides the opportunity for intensive instruction in studio production and sustained engagement with the critical, theoretical and historical discourses related to contemporary art practice. Students can major in Art Studio or Art History/Museum Studies.

Portfolio Requirements

Students applying for the Art Studio major must submit a portfolio. Portfolio requirements can be found on p. 168 of the 2018/2019 University of Lethbridge Calendar and at www.uleth.ca/finearts/departments/art/admissions.

Courses

B.F.A. - Art students must take Art History 1000 - Introduction to Art, Art History 2001 - Contemporary Art Practices and Theories, Art History 2225 - A Brief History of World Art, Art 2031 - Foundation Studio (Drawing and Image), and Art 2032 - Foundation Studio (Object and Space). These courses provide the basic preparation necessary for all upper-level courses. In their final year of study, Art Studio majors take Art 3040 - Advanced Studio and Art 4048 - Senior Studio, providing an opportunity for self-directed work in a supportive peer environment.

U of L Art Collection

All Art students benefit from first-hand examination of original artworks in the University of Lethbridge Art Collection. One of the most impressive collections of any educational institution in Canada, it includes artwork representing several movements from Canada, America, and Europe spanning the 19th and 20th centuries, and continues to grow with 21st century additions.

Visiting Artist Program

The Visiting Speakers in the Arts Program, offered through Art NOW and Architecture and Design NOW, provides extensive exposure to leading practitioners in the field. With several high-profile visitors every week—including artists, critics, historians and curators—students have a unique learning experience, one that illuminates national and international achievement. Course credit is available for attendance in the Visiting Speakers Series in Art 3261 - Art NOW, Art 3262 - Art NOW, Art 3210 - Architecture and Design NOW I, and Art 4210 - Architecture and Design NOW II.

Career Opportunities

In addition to creating artwork, careers in Art include administrative positions in galleries and museums, design, teaching, art conservation, and art therapy. Many alternatives can also be generated by using elective courses in other disciplines such as New Media, Urban and Regional Studies, Psychology, and Management.

Elective

A course that you may choose freely from all those available and applicable to your program. You may use courses inside or outside your major, but be aware of the residence requirement for the major.

Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art (B.F.A. - Art)

Note: The University of Lethbridge also offers a Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art/Bachelor of Education combined degrees program. The Department of Art offers degrees in Art Studio and Art History/Museum Studies. Within a liberal education context, the programs provide the opportunity for intensive instruction in studio production and in art history and museum studies, and for engagement with theoretical and historical discourses related to contemporary art.

Art Studio courses combine traditional and emerging media, such as drawing, painting, sculpture, computer-based art, audio art, photography, video, printmaking, installation and performance art. Spacious and well-equipped facilities permit students to undertake projects in an environment of expert technical support, creative guidance and critical dialogue. Foundation courses provide an introduction to a diversity of materials and ideas that are expanded upon in upper level courses. Senior students are allocated individual studio spaces facilitating independent art production at an advanced level.

The Art History/Museum Studies program concentrates primarily on nineteenth to twenty-first century European, North American and First Nations Art history. This degree program is unique in Canada with its combination of history, theory and hands-on museum experience at the undergraduate level. Students intern in regional public art galleries and museums and gain valuable, career-specific skills in the context of the University's renowned teaching collection of over 13,000 objects.

² Students who complete AR 1360, AR 1370, and AR 2410 will receive credit for U of L ART 2031/2032/2xxx (9.0 credit hours).

³ Electives should be chosen from courses transferable to the U of L as ART or ARHI, as listed in the Alberta Transfer Guide or U of L Transfer Credit Equivalencies Database.
