This Program Transfer Guide is designed to help you plan your transfer program to the University of Lethbridge. The information should help you keep track of your progress. Please remember that this is only a guide. It must be used in conjunction with the Grande Prairie Regional College and University of Lethbridge Calendars and the Alberta Transfer Guide, which are the final authorities on all questions regarding program requirements and admission to University of Lethbridge programs. The Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management program at the University of Lethbridge is an opportunity to obtain a degree that complements and enhances your diploma studies.

Diplomas in Business Administration are outlined in the Grande Prairie Regional College Calendar. Read the appropriate sections of the Calendar carefully. If you have any questions, please contact an Academic Advisor at Grande Prairie Regional College.

Admission Requirements

Applicants may gain admission to the competitive Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management degree program by completing an approved diploma in business administration or management no more than eight years prior to admission, with a cumulative program grade point average (GPA) at or above the current admission cut-off.

Students admitted to the Post-Diploma B.Mgt. Program are also eligible for participation in the Management Co-operative Education program.

The courses listed below must be taken at GPRC or at the U of L with a minimum C- grade. Students are encouraged to take the courses listed below at GPRC, but if there is not room in their college program, students will be required to complete these courses at the U of L. When the U of L program allows, the courses can be used toward the degree, but in some cases the courses will be extra to degree.

GPRC College Course:	U of L Equivalent Course:
1. BA 2130	MGT 2400 - Management Accounting
2. BA 2030	MGT 3040 - Finance
3. EC 1010 or BA 1540	ECON 1010 - Introduction to Microeconomics
4. EC 1020 or BA 2540	ECON 1012 - Introduction to Macroeconomics

Depending on the Grande Prairie Regional College diploma, some U of L majors may require extra courses.

Duplicated Courses

Students who are admitted to the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management program cannot receive credit for courses at the University of Lethbridge for which they have equivalent credit in their diplomas. For example, a student with a business diploma who has completed a transferable Human Resource Management course in the diploma cannot take Management 3050 - Human Resource Management at the University of Lethbridge for credit. Substitute courses will be assigned by the Dhillon School of Business to replace any courses for which they have equivalent credit. Substitute courses must be approved by the Dhillon School of Business. Diploma courses that satisfy Core Requirements must have a minimum grade requirement of 'C-'. Students are strongly encouraged to consult with an academic advisor in the Dhillon School of Business if they have questions.

Residence Requirement

Students must complete at least 20 University of Lethbridge courses in the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management program, 10 of which must fulfill the modified Liberal Education List Requirement. In addition, accounting majors must complete five of the following: MGT 3100, MGT 3101, MGT 3130, MGT 3131, MGT 3151, MGT 3160, MGT 3170, MGT 3180, MGT 4110, MGT 4130, MGT 4151, MGT 4160. In some cases, where a diploma does not provide the appropriate background for the major chosen, students will be assigned extra courses.

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in Statistics 1770; Writing 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses, including courses cross-listed with Management; and all courses in the major marked with an asterisk (*) in order to meet degree requirements.

Note: Students who take Economics 1010 and/or Economics 1012 as part of their degree requirements must achieve a minimum grade of 'C-'.

Prerequisites

You are required to meet all prerequisites for individual courses in the Post-Diploma program. If the major selected is different from that in your college diploma program, be aware that you may lack the prerequisites. For further information, please refer to the 2018/2019 University of Lethbridge Calendar (Courses) or consult the Management Undergraduate Programs Office (M2060 | phone: 403-329-2153).

Note: Mathematics 30-1 or Pure Mathematics 30 is a prerequisite for a Mathematics course required in the Accounting, Economics and Finance post-diploma major programs at the University of Lethbridge. Students who do not possess this course are advised to upgrade before transferring to the U of L.

Liberal Education List Requirement

The Liberal Education List Requirement must be met by all students at the University of Lethbridge. This requirement is based on the liberal education philosophy of the University and is designed to ensure that students acquire breadth of knowledge encompassing a wide range of disciplines.

Students registered in the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management are required to complete a modified Liberal Education List Requirement consisting of four (12.0 credits) courses from the Fine Arts and Humanities list, two courses (6.0 credit hours) from the Social Science List, two courses (6.0 credit hours) from the Science List, and two additional courses (6.0 credit hours) from any list.

Only four courses from one discipline (e.g. ECON, MGT, MUSI) may be counted toward the Lib Ed Requirement. Only four courses from EDUC, ABHL, ADCS, HLSC, NURS, PUBH, TREC, and MGT may be counted toward the Lib Ed Requirement.
