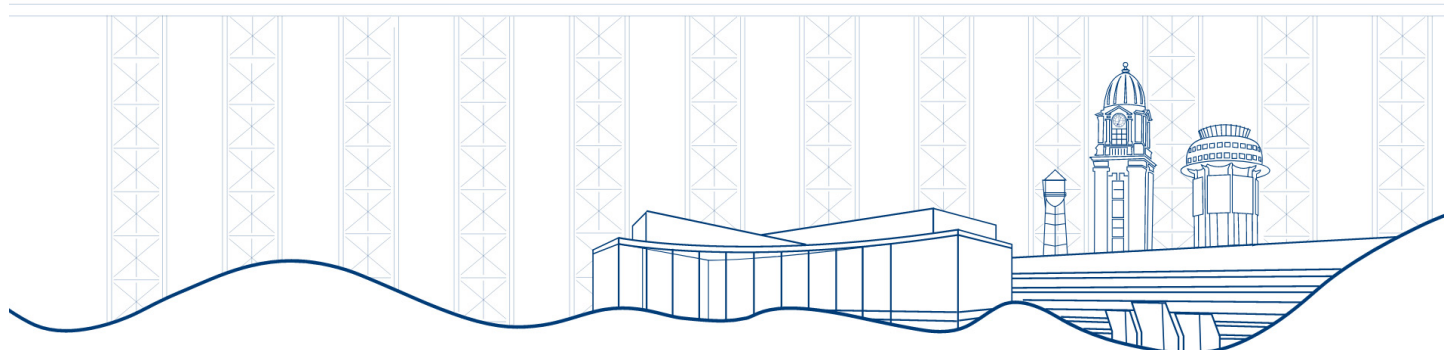

General Requirements

Students must meet the academic standards, program requirements, and graduation requirements according to the regulations set by the Dhillon School of Business, and as outlined in the Calendar including, but not limited to:

- _____ Successful completion of at least 20 courses (60.0 credit hours) and a GPA of at least 2.00. To determine graduation grade point averages, see **Dhillon School of Business, Graduation** in the 2024/2025 University of Lethbridge Calendar, www.ulethbridge.ca/ross/academic-calendar.
- _____ A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in all Dhillon School of Business courses (ACCT, AGEM, FINC, HRLR, IGBM, IMGT, MGT, and MKTG) and courses cross-listed with Dhillon School of Business courses; and when required Economics 1010; Economics 1012; Statistics 1770; Writing 1000 or English 1900; and all courses in the major marked with an asterisk (*) in order to meet diploma requirements.
- _____ All diploma requirements must be completed within 10 years after acceptance into the Dhillon School of Business.
- _____ Residence Requirement: Students must successfully complete at least 10 courses at the University of Lethbridge.
